Observe – REFLECT – Apply

*** Read through the passage – more than once – in multiple translations ***

OBSERVE – What Happened? What was Said?

- 1) Summarize the passage in a sentence or two
- 2a) Basic Details: What stands out to you? (Important? Like?/Dislike? Bother you? Unknown?/Confusing?) * Does anything raise a question? * Are there repeated words or phrases? * Key on the beginning and end of a section * Ask: Who? What? Where? When? How? Why?

REFLECT – What is the Lesson God wants People to Learn?

- 2b) What is the significance of each Observation Details that stood out to you? (What insights do they give about the passage?) Things to consider:
 - ♦ Context
 - Cultural details
 - ♦ Place in God's overall plan
 - ♦ Relevant cross-references
- Look at the BIG PICTURE...
- 3) What is the Key Verse(s)? (A verse that sums up or explains the passage)
- 4) What is the Overall Subject?
- 5) What are the Lessons?
- 6) What is the Main Lesson (Theme)?
- ➤ What does the overall passage say or show about the relationship God wants to have with you? EXAMPLES:
 - ◆ God's nature; His desire for a relationship; His role in the relationship
 - ♦ Our nature; Our need for a relationship; Our role in the relationship
 - ♦ Obstacles to the relationship; Ways to grow/improve the relationship
 - ♦ The role that *grace* plays in the relationship
 - ♦ The fact that God is in control & loves us and how trusting that impacts us

APPLY – How Do *I* Need to Grow or Change?

- 7) In what ways does the lesson apply to me? (What changes do I need to make? In what way do I need to grow?)
- 8) What are specific steps I will take to live out the lesson... change... grow?
- Pray for God to continue to work in your life in this area
